



## Dr. Malcolm Ogborn, Clinical Professor Division of Nephrology



Dr. Malcolm Ogborn is appointed as a Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at the University of British Columbia, Department of Pediatrics, Division of Nephrology. He initially settled in BC in Prince George in 2008 as the Associate VP Research at UNBC where he taught Pediatrics and applied physiology within the Northern Medical Program, conducted outreach clinics for children in Northern BC with kidney disease and is a regular attending specialist at BC Children's Hospital. In 2009, he accepted the role of Director of the Northern Renal (kidney) Program, a joint appointment of Northern Health and the BC Provincial Renal Agency. At the conclusion of his 5 year term at UNBC, he moved to Kelowna, where he now teaches in the Southern Medical Program and has recently joined Interior Health as the Executive Medical Director responsible for the Kootenay Boundary and East Kootenay region. He has a passion for medical leadership development and has been awarded the Certified Canadian Physician Executive credential. He is the author of the DocWhisperer.ca website, a resource for physicians early in leadership careers or positions.

Dr. Ogborn graduated with a degree in medicine from the University of Adelaide and completed specialty training in Pediatrics at Flinders Medical Centre in South Australia and Princess Margaret Hospital for Children in association with the University of Western Australia. Dr. Ogborn joined the Faculty of Medicine at Dalhousie as an Assistant Professor and Pediatric Nephrologist in 1986.

In 1989, he moved to Winnipeg to re-establish an academic section of Pediatric Nephrology within the Winnipeg Children's Hospital and the Department of Pediatrics and Child Health at the University of Manitoba. In 2008, Dr. Ogborn moved the Prince George as the Associate Vice President, Research (Health), at the University of Northern British Columbia until 2012.
